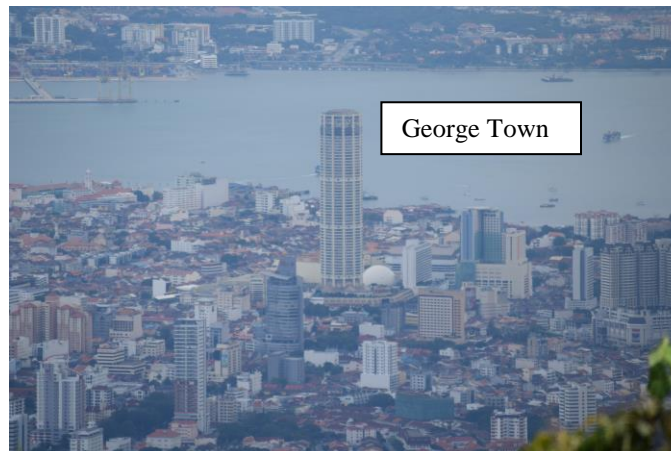

SUSTAINABLE URBAN DEVELOPMENT COURSE (SUDC)

11 – 14 November 2015

PENANG, MALAYSIA

1. Sustainable Urban Development Course (SUDC) at Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) from 11 – 14 November 2015

SUDC 2015 is organized jointly by USM and YCU. This course is offered in USM for the third time and is modeled after the SUDC designed and offered by YCU since 2012. Like the YCU course, the USM SUDC will also be conducted in English. This will be a 4-day intensive course held at USM's School of Humanities (USM's Main Campus) in Penang.

2. Course offered

(1) Title of Course:

Sustainable Urban Development Course 2015 (SUDC 2015)

(2) Brief outline:

George Town was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site on the 7th of July 2008, recognising the outstanding universal value of the city as a "Historic City of the Straits of Malacca". The city is also moving towards a green city via the "Cleaner and Greener Penang Initiative". In the city, progressive and innovative projects are successfully implemented to achieve balance between economic growth and environmental considerations. Hence, the city's experience should be shared and promoted. Under the SUDC 2015, students will be provided with historic perspective of municipal experiences as well as current condition of urban development and environmental policies. The SUDC 2015 will introduce and focus on the concept of "ECO²", or "Ecological Cities as Economic Cities" as proposed by the World Bank. In the light of climate change, the course will also focus on the theme of Disaster Management in cities. By learning from various conceptual frameworks, students would be able to understand and analyze the actual cases with solid theoretical background. This course provides students with a historic perspective of city/municipal experiences as well as current scenarios of urban development and environmental management.
