# CREATIVE THINKING WORKSHOP FOR STUDENTS

#### INTRODUCTION

Creativity is the currency of success. It is an asset which must be fully utilised to become a more innovative individual and a better decision maker through out-of-box thinking. This hands-on and casual workshop aims to help students be more creative through the use application of systematic and effective creative problem solving techniques, and as a result become more efficient in their academic and other activities. The concepts and methods learned will help participants to generate creative ideas, and solve problems effectively. The creative energy acquired will expand their vision and help them to deal with problems with better creative ideas. Indirectly, this workshop will also help prepare students for the workplace.

## **OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To teach students with systematic and effective problem solving techniques.
- 2. To enhance students' creative thinking skills.
- 3. To prepare students' with soft skills which will be useful in securing employment.

# WORKSHOP OUTLINE

#### Understanding creativity

Participants will learn about what is actually meant by creativity, and its myths which have been perceived by many resulting in shallow and restricted thinking.

#### • Perceptions and paradigm shifts

This session introduces students the common ways in which we tend to perceive things including some of the common mistakes in perception which result in 'paradigm paralysis'. The participants will then be introduced strategies to help them widen and sharpen their perceptions and shift their paradigm.

#### • Understanding problems

Understanding problems require strong analytical thinking skills. Participants will be introduced simple yet effective ways to identify and recognise a problem. They will learn to determine the root causes of a problem, and how to break a large problem up into manageable chunks.

#### Generating solutions

This topic aims at enhancing participants' divergent thinking skills which involve the use of intuition, imagination, and radiant thinking. Participants will be introduced various techniques in order to generate creative ideas towards solving a problem such as Edward de Bono's Six Thinking Hats and Thinking Tools.
